




Smith's debut, the quirky memoir *Misadventures*, was greeted with a mixture of rapturous praise and bafflement, but everyone agreed it heralded the arrival of a major new talent; she was described as 'the superannuated Bridget Jones'. In *Appleby House*, Smith cements her reputation with another delightfully deadpan study of everyday life.

The story centres on the 30-something narrator and her life at Appleby House, a nondescript, shabby terrace house in the East End of London which she shares with other 'carefully selected' single girls. Smith's skill lies in writing about familiar, everyday concerns in a highly original way, with a fine attention to detail and a knack for rendering the banal hilarious. Fans of Alan Bennett will warm to Smith's wise, perceptive style.


